

This week in class 3 we have really busy. In English we have been making teaching videos to teach others about the grammar terminology we have been learning. The children have been giving examples and making some very entertaining tutorials.

In maths we have been investigating multiples. The children have really enjoyed finding rules for multiples and have impressed me with their determination to understand this. They have shown how they can use the rules and apply it to large numbers.

Forest school was great this week and the children produced some fabulous prints which can be seen in our classroom. We also conducted an experiment to look at air resistance. The children really enjoyed this and found out some interesting results.




News from Working Wolves

We have been hard at work this week and the children have been impressing us with their perseverance in their learning and with their mature attitudes in the classroom. All the children have now got one of their best pieces of work displayed on our 'Wow Work Wall' which they are very proud of.

In literacy we have been learning about using rhyme and rhythm in our poetry and have also been planning our rainforest stories based around our Michael Morpurgo class text. We have been impressed by the children's spelling this week and their ability to think about when to use the correct homophone in their writing.

In numeracy we have been solving word problems which have involved dividing by 10 and have also been applying our knowledge of the 3 times table to solving reasoning problems.

We have begun creating our own booklets in science about the rainforest animals. The children have been interested to find out more and have wanted to do further research to add detail to their information texts. We have also been designing shelters for the indigenous people of the rainforest and have been discussing the pros and cons of deforestation.

This week the Talented Trolls have been using the book "Lost and Found" by Oliver Jeffers for our Literacy activities. The children have been writing about the penguin using adjectives and finding out about penguins. Children have made some lovely pictures of an Antarctic scene featuring the penguin.

In Numeracy we have been ordering numbers by looking at how many hundreds, tens and units they have. We have also been learning to recognise coins and order them by their value.
