We have started our new topic in Science – 'Changing States'. Yesterday we explored the difference between solids, liquids and gases and looked at how their particles are arranged differently.

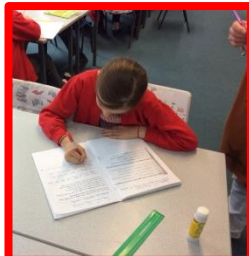
